Cleaning Procedures

C3XP Restroom Cleaning

Routine Cleaning Tasks

1. Close restroom / empty trash / disinfect container / reline/prepare for C3XP
2. Check / empty / disinfect / reline sanitary receptacles/prepare for C3XP
3. Pick up debris with lobby broom and dust pan
4. Dust area using dusting cloth or extension duster
5. Check and refill dispensers / disinfect dispensers manually
6. Select chemical and spray walls / partitions / fixtures and floors
7. Spot scrub heavy soils if necessary
8. Select rinse and rinse walls / partitions and fixtures
9. Squeegee mirror and wipe fixtures dry (as applicable)
10. Rinse floor. Squeegee water down floor drains or pick up with wet-vac
11. Use microfiber mop to detail if desired
12. Relieve pressure and wipe hoses as they are coiled and stored

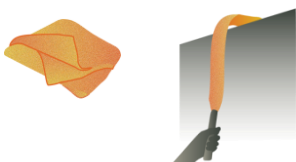
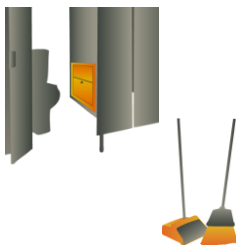
*Even though these cleaning procedures reference the Hillyard C3XP Cleaning Companion, they are applicable to any manufacturer's version of an All-Surface Cleaner.*

Routine Cleaning Procedures

A. First Circuit



1. **Close restroom** with signage. Empty the trash, disinfect interior, spot clean exterior and reline. Spray the inside of the can lightly with disinfectant cleaner. Spot clean the outside of the container. Reline the container. Optionally, you can leave the containers unlined for cleaning with the C3.
2. **Sanitary Receptacles:** Check, empty, disinfect and reline sanitary receptacles. Look inside, if there is anything inside, remove the liner; never empty the contents without removing the liner, and never use an unlined sanitary receptacle. Optionally, leave the un-lined receptacle on the floor to be cleaned with the C3XP.
3. **Pick up debris** with lobby broom and dust pan. Remove any loose amenities on restroom counters such as tissue boxes, hand towels, and lotions.
4. **Dust area** using dusting cloth and extension duster. Use an extension duster to reach high places including lights, vents, emergency lighting and anything else that is inappropriate to spray with liquid. This includes all electrical or electronic apparatus. Dust the tops of partitions and other areas that are awkward to spray.

A. First Circuit (continued)



5. **Dispensers:** Check and refill dispensers; check the dispensers, open any that need refilling and leave them open as a reminder. Disinfect the exterior of all paper dispensers and surrounding areas manually. Spraying full dispensers with the C3XP may result in a dispenser filled with wet paper.

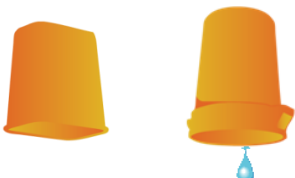
B. Second Circuit



6. **Select Chemical:** Turn the machine on, select the disinfectant cleaner, select the low pressure setting, and apply to all surfaces. Work top-down, from high to low. Start spraying walls at about 6 feet above the floor, there is no need to go all the way to the ceiling on a daily basis unless there is visible soil or debris. Begin on one side of the doorway, work your way around the room, and end on the opposite side of the doorway. Optionally, spray interior and exterior of the trash cans and sanitary receptacles left on the floor for cleaning.



7. **Spot scrub** heavy soils if necessary. This should only be an occasional task. Work top-down using the adjustable handled deck brush, scrubbing surfaces above the floor first, and then scrubbing the floor surfaces. Be sure to clean and decontaminate the deck brush before storing.



8. **Select Rinse,** change to high pressure, and working top-down, rinse all surfaces in the same order the disinfectant cleaner was applied. Flush toilets and urinals. Use care around filled paper dispensers. Do not spray electrical or electronic devices. After rinsing, turn trash cans and sanitary receptacles upside down to drain.



9. **Squeegee mirror** and wipe fixtures dry as applicable. Use a squeegee to remove water from mirrors before water spots appear. The squeegee may also be used on ceramic tile walls, and partitions to speed drying and minimize spotting, if desired. Use the squeegee to remove standing water from counters. Use a clean, dry, soft cloth to polish chrome, porcelain, and other surfaces as necessary or desired.



10. **Rinse floor.** Squeegee standing water down floor drains using a floor squeegee to push any standing water into the floor drains. If the machine being used has a wet-vac attachment, use the wet-vac to pick up standing water.



11. **Detail:** Use a microfiber mop to detail if desired. Use a microfiber mop to dry the floor, or to reach areas that the floor squeegee or wet-vac tool was unable to reach.

C. Third Circuit



12. **C3XP Hoses:** Reline trash cans and sanitary receptacles and replace. Refill dispensers left open as a reminder. Relieve pressure in the hoses. Wipe machine hoses and clean the cords as you coil and store them.
